## PRESIDENT'S LETTER

It's been an interesting spring season for those of us who work outdoors. We've been challenged by frequent and often heavy rains, though a dry summer is predicted. Then there's the high and relentless winds we've had to deal with. Plus, where was spring? We found ourselves regularly layering on clothing to work in cooler-than-expected conditions. Right now I feel like my skills for adjusting the company's work schedules due to weather and supply chain issues should have become about perfect, thanks to how frequently I've been using them lately. Hope you're finally getting a chance to catch up a bit as we roll into summer.

Another challenge has been the ever-changing prices of materials on jobs we bid now but may not get to for a couple of months. Plus, we continue to deal with those rising fuel prices and a surge in demand for petroleum products as folks resume a more normal

lifestyle again. Wouldn't it be nice to have energy independence and not be reliant on other countries for it? And have you looked at the first-quarter earnings of the world's largest oil companies? The Center for American Progress analyzed Shell, ExxonMobil, BP, Chevron and ConocoPhillips for that period. # REMEMBERING ALICE VINSAND

Alice Vinsand, IOWWA's first executive director, passed away on May 30 at EveryStep Hospice Kavanagh House in Des Moines. She founded Alice Vinsand Inc. in 1992 to provide clients with event and meeting management services, a skill she honed as a meeting planner for a national association in her previous 20+ years of work. Her association background came into play after IOWWA contacted her to provide for their meeting needs – and more – late in 2002 (possibly early 2003)! She connected family members (who also had association experience) and others she'd worked with in the association world to provide IOWWA with much-needed databases of members and exhibitors, meeting support services, board records, a quarterly newsletter and more. Many continue with IOWWA today.

Her husband Marvin, who passed away in 2019, was always present for IOWWA events; he was a jovial greeter, frequent photographer and CIOWTS proctor. Son Matt began assisting at conferences and other association management duties after returning to Des Moines in 2011. He officially became IOWWA's executive director in 2017.

"I was blessed growing up with Alice as my mother," said Matt. "As a farmer's daughter, she grew up learning drive, work ethic and a family first philosophy. She instilled those values into our family as a parent, and demonstrated those same values throughout her work career as well. Alice always thought of IOWWA as her family. She was so honored to be a part of IOWWA, and it gave her great joy helping the organization grow into the great association it is today."

"These included as a member who was an installer, an IOWWA board member and also as IOWWA president in 2008. 

It seems that most associations get started when a small group of interested parties – who share an industry, a cause or have a crisis in common – come together to advocate or even fight for what they believe and value.



In the winter issue of this newsletter in 2021, I touched on IOWWA's beginning. And I've been asked to elaborate, so sit back for a brief early history.

In 1998, the Iowa DNR's Brent Parker approached John Bien, Mike Volrath, Jim Carroll and Bob McKinney about starting an association for the purpose of industry education, with a focus on Chapter 69 of the Iowa Administrative Code on private sewage disposal systems. Parker's suggestion made sense to the foursome. Organizational bylaws were adopted on January 22, 1999, and Brent appointed Bob McKinney to serve as the first board president and Jim Carroll was vice-president. The IOWWA group looked to partner with Des Moines Area Community College for industry trainings, but plans didn't come together. When IOWWA held its first conference that year in West Des Moines, approximately 150 people attended and the wheels were in motion for installers reaching out to teach other installers.

When Jim Carroll was president, he stated in his column at the close of his year that "most of my goals for 2000 were met and exceeded, such as developing the onsite wastewater soils training manual and providing the first statewide training classes. We set up six sites around the state and had 120 people attend the classes." Carroll brought lobbyist Joe Kelly onboard for IOWWA to keep the leadership and its members in-the-know of legislative actions that would impact the onsite industry. He wrote: "Now we have the opportunity to help shape legislation and perhaps make it practical and workable."

By 2001 there were 335 participants and 24 exhibitors at the organization's educational conference. Alice Vinsand Inc. was hired to begin providing some conference support services in 2002/2003, and soon was providing many organizational management services to IOWWA in addition to conference and educational workshop coordination. The firm, now led by Alice's son Matt, continues to be IOWWA's organizational management firm.

That's enough for now, my friends. More on the growth of IOWWA at another time.


